Environmental Group

Recently, our environmental group has been going down to Abbeybrook Reserve to weed, plant and do conservation work. During the term we spent part of a Friday down at Abbeybrook, pulling invasive weeds out of our garden bed. In total the group succeeded in removing 140kg of weeds. This reduces the competition to native plants and allows these plants to grow into flourishing habitats for our native animals. On the Monday of week 11 the environmental group returned to Abbeybrook Reserve to plant saplings and small native plants in the bush. In total, the group put in an excellent effort, planting 1400 plants in just two hours. This is part of an ongoing effort to revegetate the understorey of our neighbouring bushland. Throughout the year, we will continue to care for our new plants, including watering and weeding to ensure the greatest possible success rate. Students have enjoyed planting down at Abbeybrook and participating in maintaining our local area.

Eddie - Therapy Dog

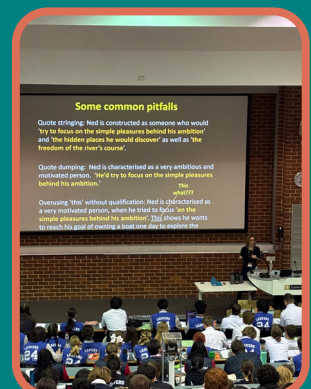

Formative Assessment: Strategy 5

- Activating Students as Owners of Their Own Learning -

Example 2 - Music

In Year 8 Music class, students prepared for a practical assessment by recording videos showcasing various musical skills. After exchanging videos and receiving feedback from another student, they were encouraged to respond to their peers' critiques and use them for improvement.

To facilitate this, students are provided with a structured table containing suggestions on how to practice various musical skills. They are then asked to incorporate tips from this table to formulate personalised plans for refining their performances before the final assessment.

For instance, if a student receives feedback on their tempo, they might use the table's suggestion to practice with a metronome to improve. This process ensures that students not only give constructive feedback but also actively engage in using it to enhance their skills, thereby reinforcing a cycle of continuous learning and mutual support.

This approach exemplifies the formative assessment strategy of activating students as owners of their own learning, empowering them to take responsibility for their improvement and growth. Below is a small section of activity and table students used to guide their reflection.

Instructions:

1. Give yourself a pat on the back for having your videos ready and having the confidence to show them to a classmate to gain feedback.
2. Consider the feedback.
3. From the 'What to Practice' column, highlight the areas that need further practice.
4. From the 'How I am going to practice' column highlight the practice technique you will use to help you improve the areas identified in Step 3. There are multiple options you need to highlight at least one, but you might like to try a second option.

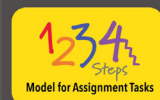

The Australian Government School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI) is offering free home internet for eligible families with school-aged students until 31 December 2025.

To be eligible, families must:

- have no active broadband service
- have a device capable of accessing the internet
- live in premises where they can access a standard NBN service
- have a child living at home who is enrolled in an Australian school

The free broadband starts from the day the service is activated with a participating internet provider. Families will not be placed on a paid service by the internet provider at the end of the free service without consent.

An Australian Government Initiative

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

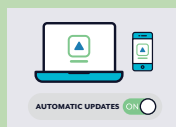

Update your apps and devices

Updating your apps and devices can fix issues and address new security concerns or weaknesses that hackers could use to access your devices or accounts. They can also add new features.



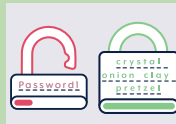
Turn on multi-factor authentication (MFA)

MFA means having more than one check in place to prove your identity on an account. For example, you may need a code from a text message and your passphrase. It makes it much harder for cybercriminals to access your accounts.



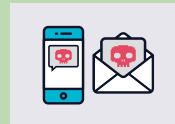
Set up and perform regular backups

A backup is a digital copy of your most important information either to an external storage device or a server on the internet like the cloud. It means you can restore your files if something goes wrong.



Set up secure passphrases

When MFA is not available, use a passphrase to secure your account. A passphrase is a strong type of password that uses four or more random words. This makes them hard for cybercriminals to guess but easy for you to remember.



Recognise and report scams

Criminals often use email, SMS, phone calls and social media to scam people. They usually do this by contacting you and pretending to be an individual or organisation you know and trust. Always be alert when clicking on attachments or links within emails or messages.



Level up your cyber security by...

- Thinking about what you post online.
- Signing up to our free alert service to receive alerts on new threats
- Talking about cyber security with your family and friends.
- Avoiding public Wi-Fi when you're banking or shopping online.
- Reporting cyber attacks and incidents to keep Australia secure.

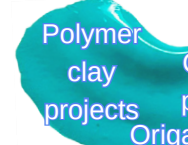

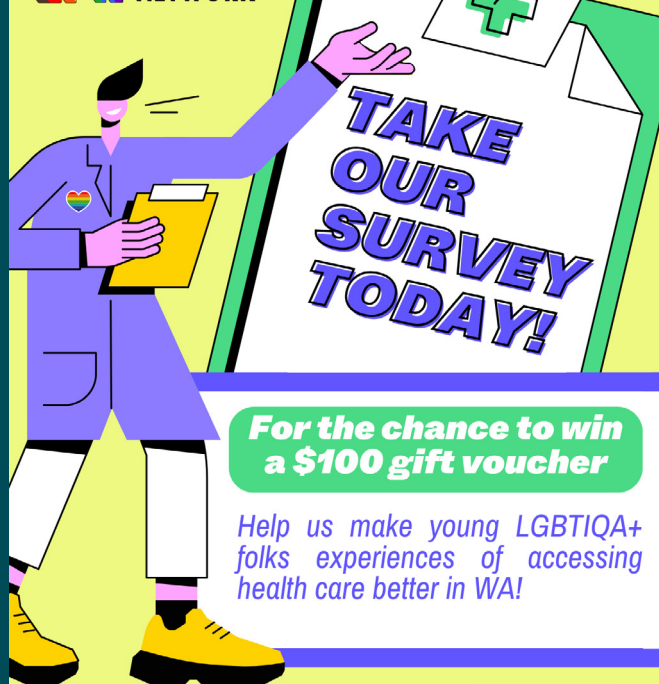

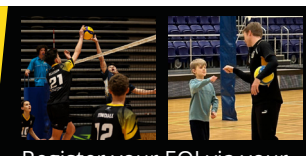
