### IDL (Interdisciplinary Learning) Presentation

Year 10 students have been hard at work preparing for their upcoming IDL presentations. What is an IDL?: An IDL aims to foster collaborative skills amongst students,

whilst bringing together their learning from two or more of their subjects. A key aim of this project is to provide students with an opportunity to develop and apply critical thinking skills and demonstrate their creativity. These skills will be valuable to students as they move into higher education, and then the world of work.



Students have chosen a project topic to answer the question "How can we be agents of change?". They are required to propose a change they would like to see, and research historical

and research historical change events to discover how agents of change have brought about the desired outcome. Students have proposed a future change that they deem necessary, they justify the need and propose strategies that will bring about the change.



#### Duke of Edinburgh - Bibbulmun Track

Students engaged in the Duke of Edinburgh program went on a two day and two night hike along the Bibbulmun Track this winter school

holidays.

They set off from the Discovery Centre in Mundaring and camped in the Helena Valley. The Northern Jarrah Forest was dormant and cold in the season of Makuru with students experiencing over 40mm of rain on the first night.

Luckily, no other hikers were at the campsite due to the poor weather and students were able to avoid setting up their tents and retreated to the hut for the night. The

to the hut for the night. The second night had far better conditions with students being able set up their tents this time and enjoy the night by a warm fire. It was a great experience for all, with students being able to challenge themselves out of their comfort zone and be introduced to a new type of adventure.

After completing these tasks, students fill out an exit ticket to reflect on their performance. This process helps them identify which concepts they understood well and which areas need further clarification. By evaluating their own understanding and pinpointing what requires additional support, students can make informed plans for their next steps, seek targeted help, and focus their efforts more effectively. This method not only boosts self-awareness but also fosters a proactive approach to their learning.
